Aviator/Pilot

Originated by Ray-Ban for pilots, the thin metal rimmed eyewear feature triangular oval lenses.



Biker

An alternative of a wrap. Specially designed for bikers as protection against strong winds and harsh surroundings.



Butterfly

Eyewear with lenses resembling the butterfly wing. Generally oversized and in plastic frames.



Cat Eye

Eyewear featuring pointy upsweep outer edges and rounded base.



Clubmaster

Eyewear with distinctive thick upper frames resembling the shape of the eyebrows.



Ful Vue

Eyewear that is partially or totally frameless, with a single "eye wire" linking the nose bridge and temples on the upper frame.



Goggles

A protective eyewear designed for active sports activities.



Mirrored

Shades with reflective optical coated lenses which effectively reduce the amount of sunlight penetrating.



Oval

Lenses and frames in the shape of an oval.



Pantos

Eyewear characterized by a keyhole bridge and thick plastic frame.



Polarized

Mirror-like shades with glare-blocking lenses which filter out intense sunlight.



Round Eye

Lenses and frames in the shape of a circle.



Shield

Another alternative of a wrap with oversized monolenses to maximize protection.



Square

Lenses and frames in the shape of a square.



Wayfarer

Eyewear with average sized square lenses and thick acetate frames.



Wrap

Eyewear with large lenses wrapped around the face to screen out the UV rays.
