#### Ascot

Similar to a flat cap differentiated by a stiffer and rounder crown.



#### Baseball

A mainstream cap with a rounded crown and a rigid protruding peak suitable for casual occasions.



#### Beanie

Close-fitting knitted hat that is typically worn during the winter time.



#### Beret

A soft, round woolen hat with no brim.



#### Boater

A flat-topped straw hat suited for formal occasions. It usually has either solid or striped grosgrain bow wrapping around the crown.



#### Bowler

A stiff felt hat with a rounded crown and short rolled-up brim.



#### Bucket

Casual cotton hat with brim to shelter the sunrays.



#### Cloche

Hat resembling the shape of a bell, often with narrow and unrolled brim.



#### Cocktail

A small, fanciful woman hat adorned with beads, jewels, feathers and sometimes a veil. It is suitable for evening dinner events.



#### Cowboy

A broad-brimmed hat with relatively tall crown.



#### Deerstalker

Commonly worn in rural areas, the hat is characterized by six triangular panels with rounded sides turned upwards and joined together.



#### Fascinator

An exaggerated headwear adorned with feathers, beads and flowers. An alternative to hat which is ideal for formal occasions.



#### Fedora

Men's classic hat. Flexible felt hat featuring pinched sides with the crown creased lengthways.



#### Homburg

Felt hat suited for formal occasions with a sole dent in the middle of the crown, slightly rolled brim and a bound edge trim.



#### Ivy/Flat Cap

Rounded crown with a hard, narrow brim protruding from the front of the cap.



### Newsboy

Suited for casual-wear, the cap features a rounded, puffed-up body and a single button on the top.



### Panama

Similar to the Fedora and Trilby hats except that it is finely plaited with lighter and more breathable materials such as straw to better suit the summer weather conditions.



### Pillbox

Small-sized brimless hat featuring a leveled crown and vertical sides.



### Porkpie

Hat featuring a low, leveled crown and narrow brim rolled-up at the edge.



### Tophat

Distinctively tall hat similar to the shape of a cylinder suited for formal occasions.



### Trapper

Russian fur cap with woolly interior and ear flaps meant for protection against the cold winds.



### Trilby

A variation of the Fedora with narrower brim and a lowered and more angular crown.



### Visor

The visor refers to a protruding piece from the front of a cap or a stretchable headband for shading purpose.
